## What can you do here?

- Hike nearly 2 miles of trails in 80 acres of forest, including the Beargrass Creek State Nature Preserve. (Trail begins behind building at end of paved path and ends in parking lot.)
- Enjoy plants and pollinators in the Sensory Garden (in the center of the parking lot) and Rain Garden (behind building, to the left)
- Meet live reptiles, explore specimens, read books, and play games in our Discovery Room
- Have fun in the Nature Play Area (at the edge of the forest behind building to the left)
- View birds in our Bird Blind (small blue building behind the LNC to the right)
- Look for box turtles in enclosure to the right behind the building (spring, summer, and fall)
